Eligibility Criteria

PhD Students

At the time of application, and throughout participation in the program, applicants must:

- a) hold active student status at a public higher education institution in Georgia;
- b) have a GPA of at least 2.5.

Junior Faculty Members

At the time of application, and throughout participation in the program, the applicants must:

- a) be **employed by a public higher education institution in Georgia** for teaching and/or research purposes;
- b) b) have defended their PhD no earlier than January 1, 2020.

Program Details

Selected participants will travel to **Dallas, USA** at the beginning of June **2026** for an **8-week program** at UT Dallas.

The program includes:

- International round-trip travel
- Accommodation and meals
- A Dallas public transport card
- Per diem allowance

The program will begin with **intensive English-language training**, followed by modules on **academic and grant writing**, **dissertation preparation**, and **presentation skills**.

Important:

- The program duration **cannot be modified**. Inability to participate fully will result in cancellation of the grant.
- Participation is contingent upon securing the appropriate **U.S. visa**.
- Pre-acceptance letters from UT Dallas faculty are not required at the application stage.
- Successful candidates must attend **mandatory virtual orientation sessions** two months before departure.
