**INTRODUCTION TO
COMMON LAW - LAW -
BACHELOR'S LEVEL (YEAR 3)**
> 6 ECTS

This course introduces the main structures and methods of the Common Law system, focusing on the role of Parliament, the courts, and the UK institutional framework. It examines parliamentary sovereignty, the hierarchy of courts, and the relationship between legislative and judicial powers. It also explains key legal methods, particularly judicial precedent and statutory interpretation.

**US/UK POLITICS - POLITICAL
SCIENCE - BACHELOR'S
LEVEL (YEAR 3)**
> 6 ECTS

The course changes every year, focusing alternately on UK or US political history and challenges.

**CRIMINOLOGY - LAW -
MASTER'S LEVEL (YEAR 1)**
> 4 ECTS

This course introduces the main theories and evolution of criminology, exploring whether it is an autonomous science and how crime can be defined. It presents major criminological schools (classical, positivist, sociological, psychological) and their explanations of criminal behaviour. It also examines how socialisation, biological, psychological and social factors interact in the study of crime and criminal justice.

**FREE MOVEMENT OF
PERSONS - LAW - MASTER'S
LEVEL (YEAR 1)**
> 4 ECTS

The objective of the course "EU Law on the Free Movement of Persons" is to introduce students to the legal framework governing the movement and residence of natural persons under European Union (EU) law, or to clarify and deepen their understanding of free movement for those who already have some knowledge of it. It covers the free movement of EU citizens and of third country nationals (TCN).

**INTERNATIONAL ECONOMIC
LAW - LAW - MASTER'S
LEVEL (YEAR 1)**
> 4 ECTS

This course provides an introduction to International Economic Law (IEL), focusing on the legal rules governing economic relations between states, international organizations, and private actors. It explores the definition, functions, and scope of IEL, highlighting its role in regulating global trade, investment, and economic cooperation.
