ABOUT THE FACULTY

The history of higher medical education at Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University dates back to 1918, with the establishment of the university and its Faculty of Medicine.

In 1919, the Faculty of Medicine was formed as an independent faculty. However, by the end of the 1929-1930 academic year, it ceased to exist within the university.

Higher medical education was restored at TSU in 1994, and in 2000, the Faculty of Medicine was reestablished as an independent faculty.



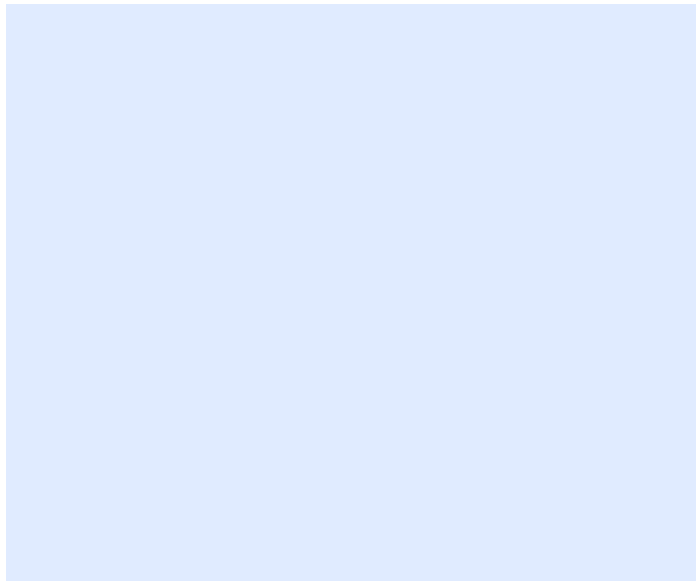

DEGREE AWARDED, DURATION, AND CREDIT SYSTEM OF ONE-CYCLE PROGRAMS

Upon successful completion of the one-cycle educational program in Medicine, graduates are awarded the academic degree of Certified Medical Doctor (equivalent to a Master's degree).

The duration of the program is 6 academic years (12 semesters) and comprises 362 ECTS credits.

Upon successful completion of the one-cycle educational program in Dentistry, graduates are awarded the academic degree of Certified Dentist.

The duration of the program is 5 academic years (10 semesters) and comprises 300 ECTS credits.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

The tuition fee is 1,125 GEL per semester for Georgian students and the equivalent of 4000 USD in GEL for international students.

What is the meaning of administrative and academic registration?

Administrative registration refers to the payment of tuition fees at the beginning of each semester (through Bank of Georgia, TBC Bank, Liberty Bank), as well as via TBC PAY (quick payment terminals).

Academic registration involves the student selecting their courses for the semester.

Where do we select the courses?

Course selection is done through the TSU Academic Process Management System – [Uni.tsu.ge](https://uni.tsu.ge)

- Students have the right to request cancellation of their administrative registration within no more than 2 weeks from the start of the academic process. After this deadline, they lose the right to request a refund of the paid tuition fee or to use it for the next semesters.
- Administrative registration by the student indicates their readiness to participate in the academic process, including semester, midterm, and final examinations. Cancellation of academic registration or requests to change selected courses are allowed within 2 weeks from the start of the academic process. After this period, refund requests or transferring the paid tuition to subsequent semesters due to service refusal are not permitted.
- Participation in the academic process without completing administrative registration within the designated deadlines does not grant the student the right to request additional administrative registration or recognition of the services received (such as interim assessments).

Can I change my study program within the faculty?

Since 2022, faculty admission is carried out by program. Therefore, you can change your study program only by participating in the mobility process.

When is the @tsu.ge email account created and is it mandatory?

Upon obtaining student status, with the support of the Information Technology Department, a student is provided with an email account

(...@tsu.ge). Information about this is available on the Academic Process Management Service's electronic portal (Uni.tsu.ge).

How many credits is a student allowed to take each semester?

A student's workload during one academic year typically includes 60–65 credits.

Medicine program students are allowed to take an additional total of 15 credits throughout the 6 years of study.

Please note that the state grant does not cover any additional semesters.

Is it possible to retake the same mandatory course if the credits are not earned?

It is possible to take the same mandatory course up to three times. However, if credits are not earned after the third attempt, the student's status will be terminated.

When is a course considered passed?

- The minimum threshold for admission to the final exam is 31 points.
- Students who accumulate at least 41 points are eligible to retake the exam.
- The final exam is considered passed if the student scores 50% or more.
- A course is considered passed if the student earns a minimum of 51 points in total.
